PASTOR'S PONDERINGS: "Hope is a Verb"



What do you know about "Hope"? It's an interesting word. When you look it up you'll find that it's not a linking verb, but an action verb. This is kind of misleading because that means it's not really an action. In other words, it's usually the word describing the action in the sentence; not the action itself. We're condi-

tioned that way a bit. Hope isn't doing something. It's just a desire for it to happen. Hoping you're having BBQ for dinner isn't the same as having it. And I really like good BBQ.

As people of faith, we are often focused on hope: hope for the future, hope for God's world, hope in God's people. But we'll often leave it there. Just hoping something happens. Have you ever wondered what it would mean for us to look at "hope" as something we do; something we live out? What might that change? ...Potentially everything.

In the Bible the book of James seems to have this focus. His famous verse is James 2:17, "So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead." These are strong words but he was trying to get across the point that we have to live our faith.

We can't just have hope, we have to live hope.

Our Worship series through September is about hope. It's called "Hope is a Verb!" I'm excited to take this journey with you!

Hope is a Verb September 1 - James 1:17-27 "Making Hope Real"

As Christians we have a key role to play. If we're going to help others see God, we'll have to live like those who know God.

September 8 - James 2:1-10, (11-13), 14-17 "Hope has a Body?"

Works are the 'body' of faith. If there is no body, there may as well not be faith.

September 15 - James 3:1-12 "Hope in my Words"


Because what we say has power, we need to do what we can to preserve the sanctity of communicating.

September 22 - James 3:13-4:3, 7-8a "Hope in my Heart"

Our true motives will always have power over us. How good are we at making those motives pure? What if our core self is what God has made, and we keep that inside?

September 29 - James 5:13-20 "Our Partner in Hope"

By living hope we have effectively teamed with God to make evident what you & God desire.

Finance Corner

Q. What is the purpose of Apportionments giving? How has UMCWV been doing with its Apportionments obligations?

A. Together, through our connected congregations of the United Methodist Church, apportionment giving allows the UMCWV to accomplish what no single church, district or annual conference ever could hope to do alone. In this way, each individual, each family, each congregation gives a fair share for the church's work. Our local church, UMCWV, has met its obligations for the last two years in a row! Currently, we have pledged \$53,385 for 2024, which is 72% of our obligation. However, less than 30% has so far been donated toward our apportionments pledge. We are hopeful that we will fulfill our obligation in 2024 to continue our trend!
